ORDER:

Hon'ble Minister (Health & Family Welfare), among others, has made the following announcement in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly on 04.07.2017 that "Special Newborn Care Units (SNCU) will be established in Padmanabapuram, Pattukottai, Periyakulam and Thirumangalam Government Hospitals at a cost of Rs.2.4 crore".

2. In the Government Order first read above, Government accorded permission to establish ten Neonatal Intensive Care units to the five Districts in Dharmapuri, Virudhunagar, Trichy, Thanjavur and Perambalur at the rate of two units per Districts. The Mission Director, State Health Society has stated that Reduction of Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) is one of the major goals of National Health Mission. To reduce neonatal deaths in the State, establishing/ strengthening the Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) is one of the core activities. Since 2008-09, the Special Newborn care units (SNCUs) have been established in the State under National Rural Health Mission, in a phased manner. So far 64 Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) have been established, orders for which have been issued in Government Order first to eighth read above. Of which, 24 Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) are in Medical College Hospitals/ Facilities functioning under Directorate of Medical Education, 25 Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) are in

District Head Quarters Hospitals and 15 Sick Neo-Natal Care Units are in Sub District Hospitals under Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services.

3. A proposal to establish four Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) have been included in the Program Implementation Plan of National Health Mission 2017-2018 and approved by the National Program of Co-ordination Committee in Record of Proceedings 2017-2018. But the Medical Officers post included in the Program Implementation Plan have not been approved in the Record of Proceedings. However, it has been decided to propose the same in the supplementary Program Implementation Plan 2017-2018.

4. The Mission Director, State Health Society has stated that as per the Program Implementation Plan(PIP) submitted after National Program Co-ordination Committee (NPCC) with certain revisions and modifications, the places of establishment of Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) at Government hospital Wallajah in Vellore District was changed to Government hospital Thirumangalam in Madurai District. However, in Record of Proceedings (RoP), this change has not been carried out. Hence, now establishment of Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) is planned on the delivery load.

5. The Mission Director, State Health Society has further stated that the centre to establish the Sick Neo-Natal Care Units (SNCUs) has been revised based on the case loads as below.

6. The Mission Director, National Health Mission has stated that the funds approved for the above civil works (Rs.48 lakh) have to be released to Public Works Department for execution of the works. In respect to Supporting staff, lump sum cost is approved. Hence, 3 female Multi Purpose Hospital Worker (MPHW) and 3 male Multi Purpose Hospital Worker (MPHW) per Sick Neo-Natal Care Units (SNCUs) as given for earlier Sick Neo-Natal Care Units will be placed.

7. The above proposal has been approved in the 33rd Executive Committee meeting. The Mission Director, State Health Society has requested the Government Order in this regard.

8. The Government have examined the proposal of Managing Director, National Health Mission and decided to accept it, accordingly issue the following orders.

- (i) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to establish four Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) in four sub district hospitals from the funds approved under National Health Mission. The details are as follows:

- (ii) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to executive the civil works at a total cost of Rs.48.00 lakh (Rupees forty eight lakh only) as per the approval in Record Of Proceedings 2017-18 through Public Works Department for constructing four Special Newborn Care Units (SNCUs), subject to the condition that the amount approved under National Health Mission has to be remitted into State Government account as per the existing procedure.
- (iii) on confirmation of remittance of Rs.48,00,000/- into the State Government account, the Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer Public Works Department, Chepauk, Chennai is permitted to issue orders to the executive engineers of the concerned divisions for the drawal of funds upto Rs.48.00 lakh (Rupees forty eight lakh only).
- (iv) sanction is accorded for creation of 13 posts of staff Nurses temporarily for a period of one year from the date of filling up of post in regular time scale of pay in the pre revised scale of pay of Rs.9300-34800+ GP-4450 revised level of pay 14 – Rs,36000-114000 under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services. The posts will be filled up as the existing procedure from the seniority list maintained by Director of Medical and Rural Health Services.
- (v) the Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to place the 27 Staff Nurses on contract basis at a cost of Rs.7700/-p.m with an annual increment of Rs.500/- to be filled up through Medical Recruitment Board.

- (vi) the details of posts should be paid by the state Health society Tamil Nadu from out of the funds approved under Nation Health Mission details of posts and mode of recruitment for the category of staff Nurses are as follows:-

- vii. The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to rationalize the placement of Sick Neo-Natal Care Units Staff as approved under National Health Mission Nurses based on the case load.
- viii. The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to appoint the other supporting staff of Female Multi Purpose Hospital Worker and Male Multi Purpose Hospital Worker on outsourcing and release the salary of contract staff as approved under Health Mission to Director of Medical & Rural Health Services.
- ix. The Mission Director, State Health Society is Directed to remit the contract payment approved by National Health Mission in respect of 13 Staff Nurses sanctioned in para 8(iv) in the following Head of account:-

“0210 – Medical and Public Health– 01-Urban Health services 800
other Receipts– BC-Receipts under National Rural Health Mission”

- x. The Mission Director, State Health Society shall also remit the cost of civil work approved under National Health Mission for the above Special Newborn Care Units into the following Head of Account:-

“0210 – Medical and Public Health – 02 Rural Health Services – 800
Other Receipts – AD Receipts from Government of India for National Rural Health Mission”

9. The Expenditure sanctioned in para 8(ii) shall be debited to the following Head of Account:-

“4211 – 00 – Capital Outlay on Family Welfare – 103 Maternity and Child Health – Central sector schemes – SA – National component – Reproductive and Child Health project – 16 Major works”

10. The Expenditure towards the salary for the post of Staff Nurses sanctioned in para 8(iv) above shall be debited to the following Head of Account:

"2210 – Medical and Public Health – 01 Urban Health Services – Allopathy, 110 – Hospitals and Dispensaries – State's Expenditure- AB – Taluk Head Quarters Hospitals, 01 – Salaries.

11. The Expenditure towards the salary for the post of Staff Nurses sanctioned in para 8(iv) above is an item of 'New Instrument of Service'. The approval of the Legislature will be obtained in course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure will be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is directed to apply for sanction of Advance from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG-I) Department directly in Form 'A' appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Fund Rules, 1963 along with the copy of this Order. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is also directed to send the draft explanatory note for including the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2017-2018 to Finance(BG-I/Health II) Department without fail.

12. Necessary funds for the amount sanctioned in para 8(ii) above are provided in Revised Estimation 2017-2018. The Chief Engineer and Engineer-in-Chief (Buildings) is authorized to incur the above expenditure towards civil work.

13. The order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O. No.6440/Finance(CMPC)department dated 05.02.2018 and ASL No.2660 (Two thousand six hundred and sixty)
