Order:

The following announcement has been made in the Governor's Address 2011-12

" All Urban Public Health Centres will be upgraded to round the clock units to benefit the urban poor."

In the Budget 2011-2012 it was announced as follows:

"As already announced the Urban Health Centres functioning in urban areas under the control of Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) will be provided with three Staff Nurses to provide 24x7 care on par with the PHCs in rural areas."

- 2. The Commissioner of Municipal Administration in his letter dated 3.8.2012 has sent a proposal for issue of necessary Government orders to implement the above announcement. He has stated that
- i. The new 117 Urban PHCs sanctioned in G.O(Ms).130, Health and Family Welfare Department dated 30.4.2012 in the Municipalities and Corporations, which are brought under the administrative control of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine may be upgraded into 24x7 by creating 3 posts of additional staff nurses, and the new staff may be recruited by the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine.

- ii. In addition to the above, out of the 9 Corporations (other than Chennai) in the 5 Corporations i.e., Coimbatore, Erode, Tiruppur, Vellore and Madurai, new Urban Health Centres have been created in the erstwhile Municipalities which have been merged with them. Therefore in addition to the upgradation of the newly created Urban Primary Health Centres into 24x7 in the added areas of the above Corporations, four Health centres one in each zone of nine Corporation i.e., Coimbatore, Madurai, Trichy, Salem, Tirunelveli, Tiruppur, Erode, Vellore and Thoothukudi may be upgraded into 24x7 by creating three additional Staff Nurse posts (i.e., 36 centres may be upgraded by creating 108 Staff Nurse posts)
- iii. Further in the following Municipalities where new Urban Primary Health Centres have not been created recently, one of the existing Health Centres, may be upgraded into 24x7 by creating 3 additional Staff Nurse posts (i.e., 13 centres may be upgraded by creating 39 Staff Nurse posts.

- i. The above Corporations and Municipalities may be permitted to fill up the additional staff nurse posts as per the service rules. The additional cost involved will be Rs. 5,01,68,160/-.
- in ii. At present, no Urban Health Centre is available 1)Maraimalainagar, 3) 2) Anakaputhur, Jolarpet, Melvisharam, 5) Ambasamuthram, 6) Vikramasingapuram, 7) Thiruthangal, 8) Valparai, 9) Punjaipuliampatti, 10) Vellakoil, 11) Thuvakudi, 12) Gudalur (Theni) Municipalities. Hence, one new Urban Primary Health Centre may be created in the above Municipalities with the staff pattern already sanctioned in G.O(Ms).No.130, Health and Family Welfare Department dated 12.4.2012 and additionally 3 staff nurse posts may also be created for running these centre into 24x7 and these centres may be brought under the administrative control of Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine.

- iii. If the above proposals are agreed to, the question of maintenance of separate seniority will not arise, since the staff created for the newly sanctioned Urban Primary Health Centres will be under the administrative control of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. In respect of Corporations and other Municipalities, where already centres are in operation, the 3 additional staff nurse are to be appointed by the respective Urban Local Bodies as per their service rules. Hence, there will not be any problem in fixing the seniority of the new appointees.
- 3. The Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department has suggested that in order to ensure attendance and discipline at the Urban Primary Health Centre level the Municipal commissioners may be given supervisory control of the new staff as well and overall administrative control may be with the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and that the 117 new Urban PHCs (60+57) sanctioned under National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) in G.O. Ms. No.130, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 12.4.12 may be made as 24x7 centres only when they reach a service of 10 deliveries per month.
- 4. The Government have carefully examined the proposals of the Commissioner of Municipal Administration and decided to accept the same and accordingly issue the following orders:
 - i. 108 contract Staff Nurse posts on consolidate pay are sanctioned to 9 Corporation viz Coimbatore, Madurai, Trichirapalli , Salem, Tirunelveli, Tiruppur, Erode, Vellore and Thoothukudi to provide round the clock service. Four Urban Health Centres one in each Zone of the above 9 Corporations be upgraded into 24x7 centres by providing three additional staff nurses to each centre.
 - 39 Contract Staff nurse posts are sanctioned at the rate ii. of 3 Staff Nurses per centre for upgrading one of the existing Health Centres in each of the 13 Municipalities Pallavapuram, Tambaram, Avadi, Cuddalore, Tiruvannamalai, Pollachi, Thanjavur, Kumbakonam, Nagapattinam, Pudukottai, Dindigul, Nagercoil Rajapalayam as 24x7 centres to provide round the clock delivery service. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services shall recruit 147 Staff Nurses sanctioned above to the 49 urban Health Centres and furnish the candidates list to the Commissioner of Municipal Administration. These staff nurses will be under the administrative control Local Bodies and Commissioner of Administration.

- iii. The administrative control of the new staff sanctioned to the 60 Urban Public Health Centres and the 57 new Urban Primary Health Centres (60+ 57=117), sanctioned in the G.O first and second read above shall vest with the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. In respect of the remaining existing Primary Health Centres in Municipalities and Corporations (323-117 =206) the staff will continue to be under the administrative control of Commissioner Of Municipal Administration for postings and transfers and other service matter.
- IV. Government sanction the establishment of 12 new Urban PHCs from the State funds at the rate of one Primary Health Centres to 12 urban the Municipalities of 1) Maraimalainagar, 2) Anakaputhur, 4) Melvisharam, 5) Jolarpet, Ambasamuthram, 6) Vikramasingapuram, 7) Thiruthangal, 8) Valparai, 9) Punjaipuliampatti, 10) Vellakoil, 11) Thuvakudi and 12) earlier which were Gudalur (Theni) Municipalitites and now upgraded to various grades, with the creation of one Doctor in time scale of pay and one Pharmacist, one Lab. Technician, Four Multipurpose Health workers (Female) / ANM, One Hospital Worker and One Sanitary Worker post (9 posts) per centre on consolidate pay as approved in the G.O second read above and the administrative control of these Centres together with the staff shall vest with the Directorate of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. The Medical Services Recruitment Board / the DPH&PM is permitted to recruit candidates to these sanctioned posts following the rules in force.
- v. The new 117 Urban PHCs sanctioned in G.O second read above under NRHM and 12 new Urban Primary Health centres now sanctioned to the 12 Municipalities shall be made as 24x7 centres with 3 staff nurses only when they reach a service of 10 deliveries per month.
- vi. The Municipal Commissioners are also given supervisory control of the new staff as well to ensure discipline and attendance and the administrative control shall however vest with the Directorate of Public Health and Preventive Medicine.
- vii. The assets (physical) shall continue to be vested with the Urban Local Bodies and they should continue to take care of maintenance, water and electricity.

viii. The Commissioner of Municipal Administration is requested to send a proposal to Directorate of Public Health and Preventive Medicine / National Rural Health Mission for additional funding under National Rural Health Mission from next year for the new Urban Health Centres sanctioned to the 12 Municipalities and for additional staff nurses sanctioned to the 36 centres in 9 corporations and 13 Municipalities. The Mission Director, NRHM is requested to include the proposal in the PIP 2013-14 for getting the additional funding under NRHM.

ix. Government orders to incur expenditure towards establishment of new Urban Primary Health Centres in 12 Municipalities, Urban PHCs in 9 Corporations and 13 Municipalities as indicated in the Annexure to this G.O. The expenditure towards establishment of new Urban Primary Health Centres in 12 Municipalities shall be met from the State Budget and the expenditure for the additional posts sanctioned for 9 Corporations and 13 Municipalities (i.e., 147 Staff Nurses Urban Local Bodies can pay from their funds for non-NRHM Municipalities and claim reimbursement from budget. Government shall reimburse for those Urban Local Bodies who are not in a position to meet out the salary and pension (i.e., already exceeded 49%) and fill in the gap for those who will exceed with this additional posts (i.e., the component of excess over and above 49%). For those Urban Local who even with these posts will be under 49%, Bodies Government will not reimburse them. The proposal for reimbursement shall be sent to Government in Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department through Commissioner of Municipal Administration with details of The expenditure of Rs.129.65 lakhs towards establishment of 12 new Urban PHCs in 12 Municipalities under State Budget shall be debited to the following head of account.

- 5. The expenditure sanctioned in para 4 above constitutes an item of "New Service". The approval of the Legislature will be obtained in due course pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure will be initially met by drawal of an advance from contingency fund, Orders regarding which will be issued by Finance (BG.I) Department, Separately. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine is requested to send necessary proposal to Government in Finance (BG.I) Department in the prescribed format, along with a copy of this order for sanction of an advance from the contingency Fund. He is also requested to send-necessary explanatory notes for inclusion of the above expenditure in the supplementary Estimates to Finance (BG.I) Department, at an appropriate time without fail.
- 6. This orders issues with the concurrence of MA&WS Department and Finance Department vide its U.O No.28287/MA&WS/12-1 dated: 20.12.2012 and U.O. No.480/Fin/CMPC/2013, dated: 4.1.2013 respectively and ASL No.2026 (Two thousand and twenty six)
